Why:

Inadequate mental health and social service support for women have profound and far-reaching consequences, contributing to higher prevalence of mental health disorders, perpetuating gender disparities, and exacerbating issues related to family and community well-being.

Mental health is directly linked to poverty and genderrelated issues child marriage, low social status, lack of education and physical abuse.



"Mental health issues are widespread, in every community, in every country, on every continent. One in four people are afflicted by mental illness at some point in their lives, with women twice as likely as men to be diagnosed.

The treatment gap is even wider in low- and middle-income countries, where **76% to 85% of people suffering from mental disorders lack access to care**."

The Empowerment Program Grant

Two-Phase Program

RTE helps foster the empowerment of women by leveraging local leadership in the communities, as the catalyst for change. This partnership enables a holistic approach ensuring comprehensive support.

Through our grant, we partner with leaders of women-focused organizations to elevate women in their communities by deploying our turn-key Empowerment Program, a holistic mental health and social service program that is tailored to the needs of the women being in their communities.

How It Works:

Leadership Training: Leverages local leaders as the catalyst for change by equipping them with the tools, funding and mentorship needed to deploy the Empowerment Program to women in their communities.

Mental Health and Social Service Program: Provides mental health support, human rights, life skills and sexual education, and job coaching for women in need to empower them to build the skills necessary for ongoing, long-term growth and improvement in their individual lives as well as their communities.



Fundraising

We are thrilled to announce that this year has been a remarkable success in terms of fundraising. Our Empowerment Campaign, our yearly online fundraising campaign, has achieved an unprecedented milestone by raising a total of \$61,000. This incredible achievement not only reflects the dedication of our team but also underscores the generosity of our donors. Thanks to the overwhelming support from our contributors, we have successfully raised over \$94,000 dollars in total, the most Ready to Empower has ever raised for our programs.

Operations for Future Partners

As we chart our strategic course for the future, we are eager to broaden our network by engaging with new partners. Specifically, we aim to deploy our Empowerment Program to collaborate with organizations led by women that currently lack a mental health and social service component. To achieve this, we are actively developing a thorough and rigorous onboarding process for new partners. This initiative is designed to facilitate growth and foster meaningful connections with organizations that align with our mission.

Leveraging Technology to Measure Impact and Improve Our Data

Data holds paramount significance for us, and we are committed to meticulously measuring the impact of our programs on women. Since our inception, we have diligently collected data. Notably, last year, we implemented Salesforce to streamline the tracking of participant data. In 2024, we are poised to extend the use of Salesforce to encompass the tracking of donor and volunteer data as part of our ongoing efforts to enhance our data-driven approach and ensure comprehensive impact assessment.

Empowerment Program

We are dedicated to refining the Empowerment Program to better serve the women in our community. In 2023, we conducted a comprehensive revision of the program, informed by the valuable data collected over the years. Additionally, we are actively developing a new curriculum for leadership training to further enhance the impact and relevance of our program. Our commitment to continuous improvement remains unwavering as we strive to provide even more effective support and opportunities for the women we serve.

Revamping Our Brand

As we commemorate a decade of empowerment, we decided to give our brand a revitalized look. This marks our inaugural effort in this direction, and we collaborated with a talented graphic volunteer to completely overhaul our brand. In addition to this, we undertook specific initiatives to effectively communicate our identity. This included crafting a new pitch deck, revising our mission statement, and updating our website with refreshed branding and messaging. The culmination of these efforts reflects our commitment to staying dynamic and relevant as we enter the next chapter of our empowering journey.

Strategic Planning & Operations

In 2023, we formulated a strategic plan spanning three to five years, shaping our path for the future. Our goal is to establish a sustainable framework while extending our reach to assist more women in need. To achieve this, we are focusing on enhancing internal operations. This includes refining project management processes, devising innovative revenue streams, and identifying the essential talent required for the successful onboarding of our first paid position for Ready to Empower.

Looking Ahead: Future Initiatives

RTE plans to continue providing support to both are partnerships in Costa Rica and India. We intend to work with our partners in Costa Rica to help them create a sustainable plan for their organization to decrease reliance on Ready to Empower to carry out their empowering work. We plan to create two new revenue streams and hire our first paid position within RTE to help reach our goal of sustainability and create an even stronger impact. Moreover, we plan to grow our volunteer & donor engagement by leveraging Salesforce in order to continue building strong relationships with our stakeholders.



^{*} The negative net income is primarily due to the fact that approximately \$15,000 from our Annual 2023 Campaign is not reflected in our 2023 financials, as it was collected in the 2024 calendar and recognized in January/February 2024. This delay in recognition means that there will likely be a surplus of \$15,000 in 2024, which will help offset much of the loss in 2023. Our expenses for calendar year 2023 were in line with our budget.
